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In a corner of the kitchen, an aluminum plate quietly gathers the day's leftovers: lemon rinds, prickly pears, cucumber peels, tomato skins, watermelon rinds, and scraps of meat, all haphazardly piled together. These remnants will later be fed to the pigs and dogs, a ritual that repeats itself daily, creating a scene that is both constant and ever-changing.
